Ruslan writes, "After the service, on my way home, I met one guy, whose name is Roma and began to talk to him about Jesus! He takes drugs, I told him that only God can free him from this."



Natasha has been doing her internship in Kyrgyzstan, which is the same location where all our students served last year. She works with youth and women's ministries.



Olga and Vitalii are from Odessa, so because she was expecting their first child, they agreed to do their internship in Odessa and work on planting a new church among foreign immigrants. Progress is slow, but I spoke with Vitalii this week and he was very encouraged. Pray for their new family and their success in planting a new church.
